










Forest Read Easy Deal

We have a variety of volunteering roles available, including:







Ecology monitoring - Surveying for reptiles, amphibians, Riverfly, butterflies and habitat to name a few. Mainly through the Spring to early Autumn. Can be done in groups, individually or as a nice family activity.

Practical conservation and outdoor teams -Managing habitat for key species, bracken and scrub clearance. This includes the Dean Green Team (who meet on a Tuesday all year round); Arboretum volunteers (the first



Thursday of every month). Volunteers must be registered with us before coming along to a session.

Beaver Fence Checkers - A rota of volunteers who regularly check the beaver enclosures perimeter fence.

Visitor Service Assistants - This involves helping at local recreation sites, including trail inspections, litter picking, fence checking, communication with visitors and working in the busy information point.



Gloucestershire Toads on Roads


